Nearly 600 People in **Eight Weeks!** By John Willome

We started using our new electronic health record (EHR) on April 7th, and over the first eight weeks I learned something very surprising. In that amount of time, our medical clinic served nearly 600 unduplicated individuals. That shocked me!

Knowing that we see between 1,000 and 1,100 individuals a year for around 2,100 medical appointments, I would have figured a two-month average for unique interactions would have been closer to 250 or maybe 300.

But here is what I learned in this process: when you are someone's medical home, they need you throughout the year. Perhaps it doesn't show up as a medical appointment (which is how I gauged it). Instead, they might call for a medication refill, come in to have their blood drawn, meet with the diabetes educator, participate in a health screening, visit a specialist to whom we have referred them, visit our licensed professional counselor, etc. The variety of interactions are practically countless and it made me even more proud of the amount of work our staff and volunteers do to serve our patients.

As for our conversion to the EHR, it is going smoother than I had hoped. The staff, to a person, likes it more than being on paper charts. The volunteers are getting better and better at using it even though they only get to work with it half a day each week. And, while we are still operating a little slower than optimum (about 70% capacity), we are getting faster as we get more patients put into the system. And I've noticed that having patients in the new EHR has already improved our efficiency in the areas where we hoped it would.

I hope that seeing the number of patients we serve, not only each year, but each month or two, excites and encourages you. You are our partners, and we are all in this together. We couldn't do what we do without you and the entire community.

A Samaritan's Story

We have to be careful when we tell a patient story because we never want to give up a patient's anonymity or privacy. Therefore, the story you are about to read is going to be a little vague, but that vagueness is intentional.

In April, our Community Health Worker (CHW), Delia De La Cruz, was working with a family in their home, and she encouraged them to come to a screening that Hill Country Memorial was conducting. The screening included blood work as well as tests to identify cancer. One person, in particular, agreed to have blood tests, but rejected the other screenings saying that cancer did not run in his family. Delia, however, was persistent, and the patient finally agreed to go through the entire program.

As it turned out, the screening identified a stage 1 cancer in this patient. Thankfully, it was caught very early and the patient was able to access funding from a government program for this specific type of cancer. Best of all, the patient was able to get all of his treatment right here from Fredericksburg. The surgeon told our director, John Willome, the surgery was easy and the patient is "cured and cancer free," thanks in no small part to early detection through CHW outreach.

This is exactly the kind of service we wanted to accomplish with our CHW program. We were confident in our ability to handle what comes in the door in a very efficient and effective manner. But we felt we hadn't done enough to proactively reach out to those who are not coming to us. Now we are better able to leverage our relationships with the medical community in Fredericksburg and help our neighbors live healthier lives. There is still a lot of work to do, and we have a lot of people to reach, but there is also no denying that our CHW program is having a positive impact on the health and wellness of our community.

We would be remiss if we didn't take another opportunity to thank St. Barnabas Episcopal Church and those who joined them in raising enough support for the first two years of the CHW program. We also want to thank Hill Country Memorial for doing so much for our patients, including the "Salud for You" program. We are grateful to every specialist in Fredericksburg and the surrounding communities for being so generous with our patients. And finally we thank you for being there to support us with your donations, your volunteer hours and your prayers. You are a part of this story as well.

Kristin DeGroot Charms Spring Dinner Guests



In 1987, young Regina Rosenwinkel was training for her career as an administrator for the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) in Killeen, Texas. One weekend, on her way to Austin, she stopped for lunch in Fredericksburg.


"I even remember it was at the Altdorf Biergarten," she said, laughing, "But I don't remember what I ate. I'm sure it was delicious."

Years later, when it was time to retire, Regina decided she didn't want to live any place where hurricanes or snow were a constant threat. Then she remembered Fredericksburg. That was back in 2009.

It was shortly after relocating to Fredericksburg that Regina learned about the Good Samaritan Center. While playing the ancient Chinese game of Mah Jongg, she met Cheri Snyder, our volunteer director, and it wasn't long before Regina had signed on as one of the Center's volunteers.

This summer's musical, *Evita*, is her third production with the Fredericksburg Theater Company. She also plays the dulcimer.

Music, in fact, is an important element in her life. Regina is a member of and sings with the Canto Choir, the Fredericksburg United Methodist Church Choir and the German Choir. Recently, she teamed up with her four-legged partner, Teddy, and started offering Teddy Grams to those celebrating birthdays, anniversaries and special occasions.

"Teddy is a ShiChi, which means he's a cross between a Shih Tzu and a long-haired Chihuahua," she said. "I sing and he loves."

Regina has three grown children, one son and two daughters, and two grandkids, all of whom live in states where hurricanes (Florida) and snow (St. Louis) are realities. She's happy to visit, but says she's very glad she lives in the Texas Hill Country. We're grateful she's here, too!

"For all my 22 years at the CIA, I regretted that I couldn't work as a volunteer. I felt bad and, when I retired, I vowed to give back."
